

Winter Tiered Pricing Extended

To provide greater price stability for consumers staying at home due to COVID-19, the OEB is keeping the prices set in November 2019, and the winter tier threshold for households, in place after May 1, 2020.

On May 1, the winter tier threshold for residential customers usually shifts to its lower summer value of 600 kWh/month. **Keeping the winter 1,000 kWh threshold provides households with an additional 400kWh/month at the lower price.**

Households on tiered pricing continue to pay 11.9¢/kWh for the first 1,000 kWh of electricity they use per month; 13.9¢ for each additional kWh. Small businesses on tiered pricing continue to pay 11.9¢/kWh for the first 750 kWh of electricity they use per month; 13.9¢ for each additional kWh.
